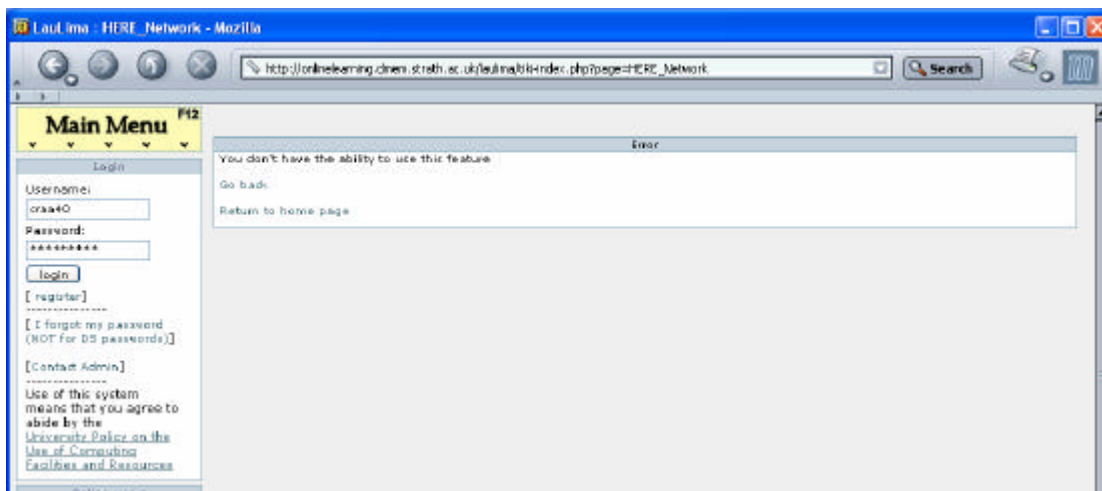


To login to the HERE Network Forum go to

You will see the following page, with a login box in the upper left hand column. The instructions for logging on for the first time are different depending on whether you are a Strathclyde university user or not.



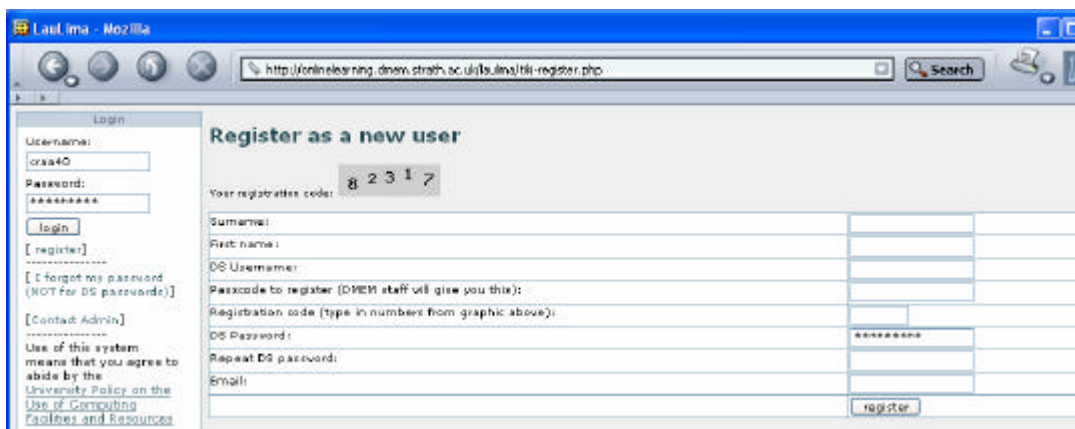
Non Strathclyde users:

Non Strathclyde users have already been pre-registered and your username should be in your delegate pack. To obtain a password, click on [\[I forgot my password \(NOT for DS passwords\) \]](#)

link in the left hand login box. You will be asked to type in your username and a password will be emailed to you – the system already knows your email address. Please note that by doing this you will be agreeing to abide by the University Policy on the Use of Computing Facilities and Resources.

Strathclyde University users:

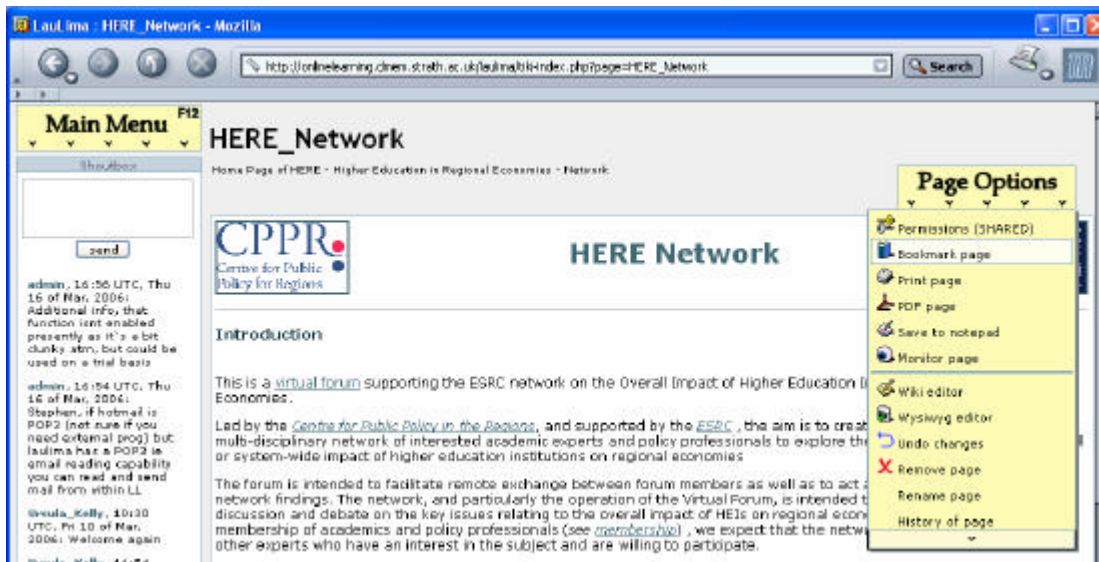
Before you can use the HERE forum you need to register by clicking the [\[register\]](#) link in the left hand login box. You will then see the following page.



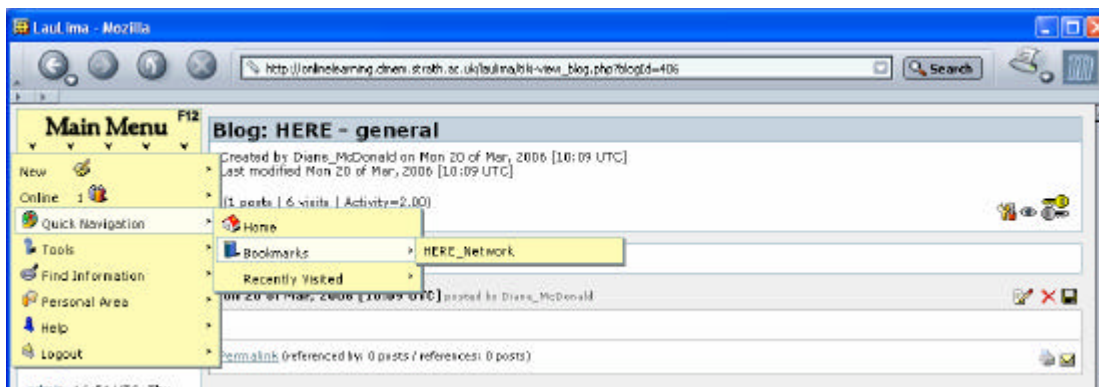
Fill out the registration form. The 'Passcode to register' is 'yellow32'. (Omit the ' '). Once this form has been completed you will be able to logon, but will not have access to the HERE forum pages until you are assigned access by the system administrator. This should be completed within 2 working days, but generally within the same day.

Important – Navigation:

Once you login, place the mouse over the right hand **Page Options** bar. A drop down menu will appear. Click on bookmark page.



This will add a bookmark to the HERE home page. From anywhere on the wiki you can always get back to the HERE home by clicking on the **Main Menu** and then selecting **Quick Navigation** followed by **Bookmarks** and finally **HERE_Network**.
